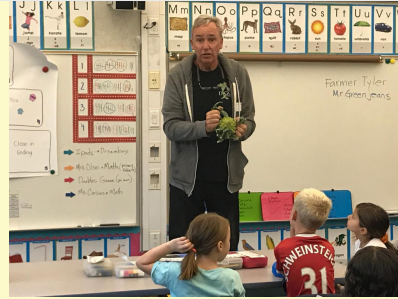

Measure E ballots are out!

Measure E, the local parcel tax measure for Reed Union School District, is on the ballot this November. Measure E would renew the district's expiring local parcel tax that today accounts for 10% of the district's budget and funds the equivalent of 23 teachers each year. Measure E would renew the existing rate and structure at \$589 per parcel with a 3% annual increase and would be in place for 12 years. All funds would stay local and no funds could be taken away by the state. Election Day is November 5. To pass, the measure must be supported by 66.7% of those who vote.
